Thank you for registering for the **Public Safety at Festivals and Mass Gatherings** course. This course is for people who have public safety planning responsibilities for outdoor events and need to develop their planning and crowd safety arrangements.

1. **What to do now:** review the events for which you are responsible and discuss them with colleagues from various parts of your organisation and other stakeholders.
